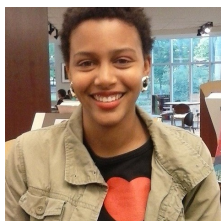

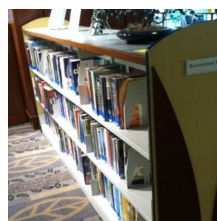

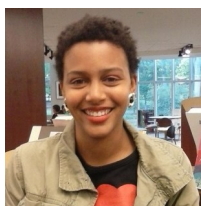

What is the last book you read and loved? The DaVinci Code. It is different than anything I ever read before.

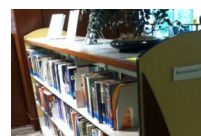
